

Office of Fellowship Education Eligibility Recruitment and Selection

The Department of Anesthesiology Fellowships adhere to the same guidelines used by the Duke University Graduate Medical Education for recruitment and selection of trainees as stated below:

Eligibility for the Fellowships:

- 2. Passed ALL USMLE exams: Step 1, Step 2, and Step 3
- 3. Fellowship Director must receive:
 - a. A completed common application including personal statement(s)
 - b. Three letters of reference
